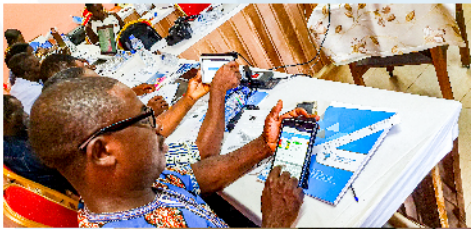

ELECTORAL VIOLENCE MONITORING ANALYSIS AND MITIGATION (E-MAM)



Electoral violence Monitoring Analysis and Mitigation (E-MAM) 2023-2026 is the third¹ phase of WANEP Regional's project designed to contribute to the monitoring, analysis and mitigation of electoral violence in West Africa. It is implemented by the West Africa Network for Peacebuilding (WANEP) in partnership with the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS), ECOWAS Network of Electoral Commissions (ECONEC) and the United Nations Office for West Africa and the Sahel (UNOWAS). The project targets twelve (12) West African countries and is funded by the European Union Peace, Stability and Conflict Prevention (PSCP) thematic programme of the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument - Foreign Policy Instruments (NDICI-FPI).

In the context of West Africa, the project aims to address the role of elections as a catalyst for electoral violence during successive electoral cycles. This includes focusing on their various management phases and understanding the internal risk factors associated with them. Oftentimes, a multitude of external and context-related risk factors converge, giving rise to conditions in which elections can act as catalysts or contributors to electoral violence. In light of these considerations, the primary ambition of the project is to make a significant contribution to the reduction of electoral violence. This will be achieved through the enhancement and mobilisation of regional and national capacities necessary for the prevention and mitigation of political violence. The project centers on the promotion and implementation of early warning and rapid response mechanisms before, during, and after elections. In order to foster rapid responses to alerts, the project will offer subgrants for one-off interventions or mini-projects, benefiting Civil Society Organisations and national and regional stakeholders.

PROJECT OBJECTIVE



To facilitate and strengthen early warning implementation processes and promote inclusive responses to electoral violence and other threats to democracy in targeted countries.

EXPECTED RESULTS



Outcome 1 (**ALERT**): Mechanisms for monitoring and analysing risks of electoral violence or threats to democracy are operationalized in targeted countries.



Outcome 2 (**RESPONSE**): Specific activities to mitigate risks of electoral violence or threats to democracy are supported and implemented in targeted countries.
